not indented, this Light is therefore chiefly intended as a g into Annapelis Bason.

Gannet Rock Light.—This Light bears from the Light Bryer Island N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 21 miles; and will be of a brired colour, to distinguish it from others in the vicinity. It is tended to warn ships of their approach to a very dangerous ra of Shoals and Ledges, which extend from the old Proprieto the Seal Island off Machias, a distince of about 20 miles.—I old Proprietor which dries at $\frac{3}{2}$ ebb, bears E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. about 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles from the Light. St. Mary's the Southermost of the murr ledg S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles. More than the light of the seal Island, W. point W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 12 miles.

Head Harbour Light.—Next in order after passing Gri Manan, is Head Harbour Light. this is placed on the Nor East extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels ent ing the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the ner Bay of Passanaquoddy, it enables vessels also at all times enter Head Harbour.

Point Le Preau Lights.—Upon this projecting Head La two Lights have lately been placed, one above the other, a distant 18 feet. Both Lights may be seen from every point the Compass, where they can be useful, these Lights will be u ry beneficial to the navigation of the Bay, and it is heped m prevent a recurrence of losses which have so frequently happe ed in this part of the Bay.

ed in this part of the Bay. Partridge Island Light, -- This Light at the entrance of th River, and Harbour of Saint, having been established upwan of 40 years, requires no particular notice.

Beacon Light.—Within Partridge Island and upon a spit, Bar which extends about half a mile, S. S. E. from Sand Poin and which dries at $\frac{2}{3}$ ebb, stands upon the Beacon Tower. U on this Tower a Light is established which is eminently useful the Coasting Trade of Saint John, and to all other vessels h ving Pilots on board, as it enables them to enter the Harbour St. John at all hours of the night.

Machias Scal Island Lights — Is addition to the above me tioned Lights, contracts are now offered for erecting two Lig Houses on the Seal Island off Machias, these Lights will be elvated about 45 feet above high water mark, and will be distan from each other about 200 feet, in the direction of N. N. W. an E. S. E. by which they will be immediately distinguished from any other lights on the Coast, (British or American.)

West Quoddy Light.—This is an American Light, and placed on the West side of the entrance into the St. Croix h Labec and Eastport; a new Light House has lately been erecte here, and the Light much improved.
