

FIFTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Committee of Management of the St. George's Society
FOR THE YEAR 1893.

The Committee of Management have the honor to submit the following report of their proceedings during the past year, being the fifty-eighth since the foundation of the Society :—

The anniversary of St. George's Day was celebrated by Divine Service in the Cathedral on the 24th April last, at which the Rev. L. W. Williams kindly preached an eloquent and patriotic sermon ; a large and appreciative congregation attending. The musical part of the service was as usual admirably rendered by the talented choir of the Cathedral, under the able direction of Mr. E. A. Bishop, organist, to all of whom the Society is again indebted for their valuable assistance.

The collection amounted to the handsome sum of \$67.

As authorized by a resolution passed at the general annual meeting, held on the 5th of January last, donations, of \$50 each, have been made to the Finlay Asylum, Ladies' Protestant Home, Women's Christian Association and Jeffery Hale Hospital.

The report of the Sub-Committee of Charity shows the Society has been able to relieve 126 cases of distress during the year at a cost of \$391.61. (For particulars see report of Sub-Committee.) These two important items make a total of \$591.60, which the Society has dispensed in the charitable cause.
