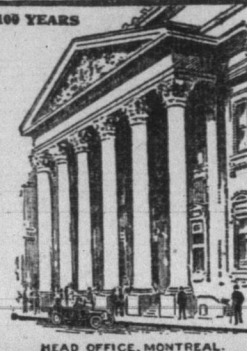

A leading dressmaker in Paris approved. That the garment was comfortable was a surprise. No one thought of the reason or that it was the first great step toward naturalness.

An aggressive manufacturer of the New World had courage to adopt the idea and put front-laced corsets upon the market. They were brought to the attention of doctors and to the doctors, perhaps, belongs the first credit of attributing naturalness to this style of corset as an improvement over the old styles they had condemned. Doctors said it was natural that a corset should be built to conform to the bony structure of the body—the firm part in the back where the body offered a firm base and the opening in front where it could be easily adjusted to suit the comfort of the wearer.
