FOSTER, Hon. GEORGE EULAS, B.A., D.C.L., P.C. (King's N.B.)

Ed. at the Common and Superior schools, in King's Co., and at the Univ. of N.B., where he graduated B.A., June, Spent 1872-3 at the Univ. of Edinburgh, Scot., and at the Univ. of Heidelberg, in Germany. Was Principal of Victoria Co. Grammar Sch., 1868-9; of Sunbury Co. Superior Sch., 1870; Classical and Mathematical, Baptist Academy.
