Resigned in 1868 to accept the position of Inspector of Prisons and Asylums for P.Q. Elected to Commons at last g.e. A Conservative.—Montreal.

DESJARDINS, T. C. ALPHONSE. (Hochelaga.)

Family settled in Can. before the cession to Eng. B. at Terrebonne, P.Q., 6 May 1841. Ed. at Masson College and the Seminary of Nicolet. M., 19 May, 1864, Virginie, eld. dau. of the late Hubert Paré, Esq. (she d. Feb. 15, 1879). Called to the Bar, L.C., 1863, and practised his profession in Montreal until 1868, when he abandoned law for journalism, and became one of the editors of L'Ordre. for some years chief editor and one of the directors of Le Nouveau Monde. Retired from journalism in Sept. 1879. President of the Jacques Cartier Bank. Created a Knight of the Order of Pius IX., 30 July 1872, after his return from a visit to Rome, where he had the honour of being admitted to an audience with His Holiness. Took an active part in the organization of the Canadian Papal Zouave contingent, which went to the assistance of the Holy Father, 1868. Was one of the authors of the Programme Catholique, first published April 1871, which was prepared for the purpose of being offered to the Conservative party as a basis on which the several opposing sections of that party, then engaged in a warm contest, might agree.
