Author of *The Practical Application of Passing Bills to the Improvement of our own Country*; a lecture (St. John, 1833); *the Isthmus of Panama*, a sketch (do, 1835); *An Oration at the Entrance of the University of New Brunswick* (do, 1838), and of numerous other published lectures and addresses. Appointed Arbitrator for the Division under the 142nd section of the R. N. America Act, 1837-38. Sat for present seat in N.B. Assembly from 1850 until 1852, when defeated at g. e. Returned again on the death of Mr. Jordan, the sitting mem., in March, 1853. Sat from 1853 until 1855, when on dissolution on the Union question, was defeated at the g. e. with Messrs. Tilley, Fisher, and other supporters of the Union. Returned again at g. e., in 1855, on the Union question being again submitted, and sat until the Union in July, 1857. Returned to Commons at that g. e. by acclamation. Among the measures introduced by him and carried through the N.B. Parl., may be mentioned: the consolidation and amendment of the laws regulating letters patent; an act giving committees of the legislature judicial powers on investigations in relation to public offices and public works; an act authorizing magisterial investigation in cases of fire without preliminary com-
