every barrel of mackerel caught and landed by the United States' mackerel vessels during the existence of that duty.

In the evidence adduced on behalf of Her Majesty's Government this point has been established beyond possibility of refutation. The average prices obtained by the fullowing firms, viz., A. H. Crowe, Lawson and Harrington; and Young, Hart and Co., in golll, at Halifax, after payment of duties and all other charges, are given by the various witnesses as follows, the sales being made in all cases to United States' buyers.

It will he nbserved, then, that the Halifax merchants had to submit to no decline in price from 1866 to 1873.

The evidence adduced on behalf of the United States proves the prices at which mackerel caught by United States' vessels in the Bay ofi St. Lawrence during these same periods were valued, on settling with the crews (eaclusive of the cost and profits of packing, which would have increased the prices by 2.00 dollars per barrel), to have been as follows:-
