The series will be starting up on Oct. 4 with The Gents, Canada's foremost male vocal sextet. In white-tie-and-tails, these six accomplished musicians are reportedly dedicated to quality music and mild mayhem. The Gents will be singing traditional ballads, shanties and a bit of nautical nostalgia, in addition to barbershop quartets and renditions of many pop hits by The Beatles and The Beach Boys. Be prepared—they've been known to encourage the audience to join them in a round or an Austrian yodel.

Following The Gents, on Oct. 16, is one of the finest guitar ensembles in the world, the Amsterdam Guitar Trio. Since their debut in 1981, the Trio has toured the United States, Canada, the Far East

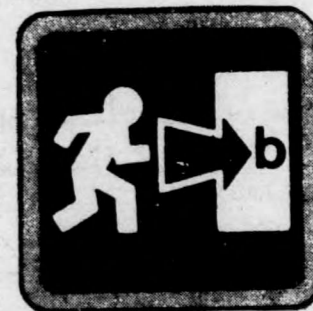
