Dear Sir,-

I trust you will pardon my presumption in writing you this letter, nevertheless, I am in need of some information and know of no other source to which I can apply.

I am supporting the resolution in a debate before the Macdonald College Club on the following:

"Resolved that in the best interests of Canada, labour and the community should participate in the control of industry." I should appreciate it very much if you could put me in touch with some concrete information relative to this question. Also, in view of the fact that we must argue from a more or less idealistic standpoint and have a limited length of time to establish a case, what would you suggest as the best method of dealing with the question?

I believe that the big argument of capital is the unwillingness of labour to participate in the losses. How should this argument be met? Relative to the community, should we attempt to formulate a scheme outlining the extent to which it should participate?

I feel rather hesitant in troubling you with these importunities however, I assure you that any information which you feel free to give, or any suggestions that you may offer will be highly appreciated, for which I thank you in advance.
