I would like to add to the numerous letters on this subject which you have no doubt received, my opinion that the Church Union Bill, as originally proposed, is not in the best interests of the Presbyterian Church and is objectionable to a very large number of members of that Church. I do feel that a delay, such as proposed by the Private Bills Committee, may be the means of getting the two factions to reach some compromise. If they cannot reach a satisfactory compromise, it does seem to me to be a wise thing to have the matter settled by the Courts of the Land.
