- 6. Established a labor sub-committee of the Reconstruction Committee of the Cabinet, giving labor thereon two representatives.
- 7. Passed the Civil Service Act.

After his return he wrote
a book entitled "Industry
and Humanity", the principles therein enumerated

He was chosen leader of the Liberal party in 1919, and at that time promised:

- 1. To reduce the cost of living.
- 2. To reduce taxation of the poor and increase it on the rich.
- 3. Promised to tax luxuries.
- 4. Promised immediate and drastic action by government with respect to profiteering.
- 5. Promised an eight hour day.
- 6. Promised additional cash grants to returned soldiers.

What is his record of performance? The cost of living has increased, income taxes on the rich have not. No new taxes have been placed upon
