- (5) The return of stales and the feeding of wheat, flour or bread to animals will be prohibited except insofar as the feeding of low grade wheat may be necessary to maintain livestock.
- (6) We will acquire from farmers the wheat they have on their farms for certificates on the basis of \$1.55 per bushel which will be payable within three years without interest and payments will become liable to taxation in the year in which certificates are redeemed.
- (7) Farmers are urged to plan their crops so as to produce the largest possible crop having regard to the fact that the needs of the world will absorb all that Canada can produce over the next four years at least.
- (8) The crop in Canada will be acquired from the farmers on the basis of \$1.55 per bushel in 1946 and 1947 and the price will be reconsidered for 1948 and 1949 but it will not be less than \$1.25 per bushel in 1948 and 1949, at which prices the British government has undertaken to acquire any surplus we may have, at prices the government of Canada pays the farmer.
- (9) Additional oats and No. 4 Manitoba wheat will be shipped abroad if not required in Canada.
- (10) Necessary priority will be given for transportation.
