

Defending Officer: I object. He says under the Defence Regulations and he is not entitled to say that. He has to produce authority for saying it is a protected area.

Judge Advocate: Are you familiar with the area?
Witness: Yes, sir.

Judge Advocate: Can you produce the authority.

Witness: I have seen a copy.

Q.23 Is it part of your official duties to know whether certain areas are protected areas?
A.23 Yes.

Q.24 Can you tell the Court whether the Newhaven area was or was not a protected place on or about 9th November last?
A.24 Newhaven Port area was made a protected place under Defence Regulation 12.

The Court gave the witness permission to retire to consult Official Records.

In the opinion of the Court and the Judge-Advocate it is not necessary to comply with R.F.83(B).

The Defending Officer declines to cross-examine the witness.

Q.32 Do you recognize the accused?
A.32 Yes, I recognize the Sergeant-Major.
