on the official blueprint. Kahoose's place was marked on the blueprint "X5", it being indicated on said blueprint as "Indian Ranche", (Lot 394), apparently of 640macres, reserved from alienation. Witness also identified on the blueprint Kapoose's place, which was merked "X6" and which on the blueprint is marked 61694. The Enhouse place bears the reference number 61694. Witness was acquainted with Mr Brynldsen of Bella Coola; he did not know of any land purchased by that gentleman in Espoose's behalf. Both Espoose and Eshoose . were "pretty well to do". The Ulkatche Indians applied to the Commission for these meadows , on which they out their hay. There was also some good open prairie at Lot 394, which they would like to get. (Note: The Kapoose application apparently covers part of Lot 392 as well). Witness indicated in connection with this application the northern half of Lot 392 (marked "X7" on blueprint). The gardens referred to in which postatoes and other vegatables had been grown by the Ulkatchas were along the Salmon River; timethy also throve there, even better than vegetables. If the Ulkatche Indians could get these lends now applied for, and a piece of garden land on the Salmen River, they would have sufficient land for all their requirements. If these lands now applied for were obtained, the Ulkatchus would not need the upper or northern portion of the established Reserve at all -- the portion marked "X8" on the official blueprint -- and would be content to have that part out off from the old Reserve. There was no graveyard on that northern part of the Reserve. The lands now applied for would give sufficient land for the requirements of the Band. He and the head chief (Quenas Towny) were good friends and worked together. He thought the head chief would be satisfied with today's proceedings The three Ulkatchus present (himself, John and Frank) spoke for all o the Tribe; and their satisfaction with the arrangements tentaively tentatively outlined would be endorsed by the Band.
