MAKING A WILL There are scores, if not hundreds, of Baptists who, if they do not give all they ought while living, should make a will, and give at their decease. Will not the Pastors see to it, that every one whom they can influence, and to whom God has given more than they can expend while living, and more than their families will need when they are gone, shall vly make a will and secure bequests for this Missionary work, that will an when they will be no longer here to give it personally.

CONSTITUTION.

The name of the Society shall be the Baptist Book and Tract 1st. Society.

2nd. The object of the Society shall be to supply the Maritime Provinces with Baptist and General Literature, through Colportage and other means.

3rd. That any person being a member of any Baptist Church, and contributing not less than (\$5.00) Five Dollars to the funds of the Society, shall be considered a member.

4th. The Society shall meet annually at the time and place of the Baptist Convention in the Maritime Provinces, when a report of the work of the preceding year shall be given, and a President, four Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and a Board of Directors, consisting of seven members, shall be elected. The Officers shall be members of the Board. Five shall constitute The Board shall appoint a Secretary and a Committee of Management, consisting of three of its members.

5th. The Society shall have a Benevolent Fund from which to supply Bibles and Religious Literature to needy families and Sunday Schools.

6th. The profits of the Society shall be added to the Capital or Benevolent Fund, as the Society may direct at its Annual Meeting.

7th. That any alteration or amendment to the foregoing may be made by a two-thirds vote, at any regular annual meeting of the Society, notice of which having been previously given.
