to revenge but to reconciliation ' If force leads nowhere and offers no remedy, reason must be summoned to save Western Europe from social and economic ruin. Perchance the new world may recall sanity to the old. But even if the terms of peace satisfy idealists, long troubles must be anticipated. "Though we had peace," said Selden during our Civil Wars, "yet 'twill be a great while ere things be settled : though the wind lie, yet after the storm the sea will work a great while."
