

Synopsis of Canadian North-West. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 13 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 100 acres, more

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES — (1) At least cix months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required resilience duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eight (99) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself, must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
