Provincial Educational Association.

THE FOURTH ANNUAL MEETING of the Provincial Educational Association will be held in Freemason's Hall (corner of Granville and Salter Streets) Halifax, on the 11th and 12th of July, first session at 10 a.m. on the 11th.

The programme embraces, besides the Opening Address of the Superintendent of Education, the following papers: The Certificate of Teachers, by Prof. F. H. Eaton, of the Provincial Normal School; Science in Schools, by Prof. Caldwell, of Acadia College; The Kindergarten System, by Miss Jessie S. Campbell (Halifax); A Proposed method of High School Examinations, by E. J. Lay, Principal of Antwerp Academy.

An ample opportunity will be afforded for discussing the subjects of the above papers as well as for considering the course of study for High Schools to be submitted. Short papers on practical subjects will be furnished by several gentlemen. There will include Penmanship by Inspector W. D. McKenzie; Navigation as a Practical Art, by Mrs. E. H. Owen (Lunenburg Acad. Inst.); Principal Calkin, of the Normal School. The exercises will be varied with suitable illustrated lessons by various teachers.

Arrangements are being made for an excursion to points of scientific interest in and around Halifax harbor, in which it is expected that the N. S. I. N. S. and the Alumni Association of the Provincial Normal School will unite with the Association. Enrolled members of this Association will, on presentation of certificates of attendance, receive free return tickets on the Intercolonial Railway, the Spring Hill and Parrsboro Railway and the Fishery Line of steamers.

Members coming by the W. & A. R. R., the W. C. & B. R. and the H. & C. B. R. R. will be expected that return fares will be obtained on all the principal lines of travel throughout the Province.
