

A number of poor benefices in the Diocese of Peterborough will benefit under the will of Mr. William Lewis Baker, of Hargrave, Northants, who died on June 30, aged 88, and left estate valued at £34,125 gross, with net personalty £30,254. After making a number of personal bequests, Mr. Baker left the residue of his property, as to one-half (of the gross value of about £14,000, and, after payment of duties, probably about £12,500 net), to the Peterborough Diocesan Association for the fund formed by that Association for the augmentation of the endowment of poor benefices.
