COST OF G. T. P. TO CANADA WILL BE ONLY \$26,000,000

OTTAWA, July 12.—A net cost to the country of only \$26,000,000 for the National Transcontinental Railway under the terms of the government's contract with the G. T. P. was the result of Hon. Geo. P. Graham's conclusive analysis in the Commons on Saturday.
