Hindus Go Have A With

Captain of the Komagata Boards His Vessel Needs to Get Up Steam Terms Offered by Dominion Government Accepted After Delay of Several Hours. The Special Writ to the VANCOUVER, B.C. Ju before 7 o'clock last evening, through their shore agents, agreed to accept the terms Government, and will allow possession of the Komagata. There will be no fighting. The Hindus made demands, but were finally forced to accept the proposals of the Government, which were to provide medicines and \$6,000 for the return trip. 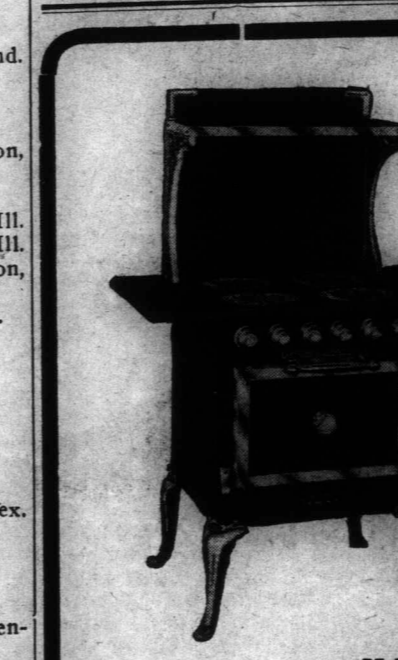
