Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and buitivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within aine miles of his homestead on a farm of at tenst 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where cesidence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-ection alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
