### HANTSPOORT BOY WINS MILITARY HONOURS.

Word has been received by Mr. John Reid, Hantsport, that his son, Driver J. Wiley Reid of the Canadian Field Artillery has been awarded the Military Medal for work done by him in the last battle in which the Canadians were engaged. Driver Reid enlisted in the C. G. A. at Halifax in August, 1915, later being transferred to the 11th Ammunition Column with which unit he went across in the following April. After training in England a few months he was sent to France as driver in a howitzer battery in which capacity he has served ever since and has been through many battles, including the Semme, Hill 70 and Vimy Ridge.—Journal.
