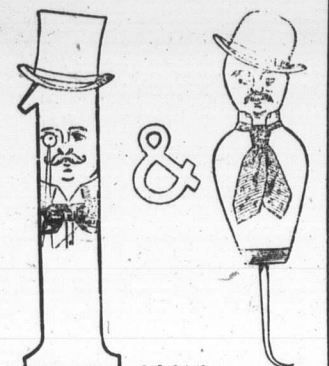

Considerable alarm is felt by the farmers near Thoreau, N.Y., over what appears to be a murrain in several herds of cattle in that vicinity. A copy of a special illustrated edition of The Comet, published at Clifton, Illinois, reached us this week. It contains the following sketch, accompanied with an excellent photograph of the subject:

Nathaniel Stevens, M. D., is a native of Canada, being born at Athens, Ont. He was educated at the public schools of his early home, and for a time was a teacher. From early youth he conceived a liking for the practice of medicine and surgery. The opportunity developed for carrying into effect his cherished desire and he commenced the reading of Materia Medica in time given to him. He was a student of the University of Queen's University, Kingston, Ont. After a brief practice in the Queen's Dominion he cast about for broader fields and in the spring of 1891 came to the States, finally settling at Ashkum, Ill. Dr. Marshall, who had gained a lucrative practice here, removing to Chicago, made opening for another physician, and Dr. Stevens succeeded him. In the time that he has lived in Clifton he has grown in favor and is recognized as a physician of prompt action and skill. As a surgeon he has successfully performed several difficult operations. Although comparatively young in years he has much sought after by older doctors in consultations and his advice is followed with good results.

DARLINS AND BECKKEEPING.

"It seems that bee-keeping cannot be made successful where Darlins are largely cultivated. A very successful beekeeper began to grow darlins in a last year, and some boys who were devoted until finally he gave up keeping them. It is said they become intoxicated while feeding on the flowers. Many of them were found in the blossoms dead or lying on the ground and those that reached the hives made very little honey."—Page 336, November Mayflower.

I have often noticed when all visible conditions required to form a successful spy seemed present that there was a missing link and with the best attention the bees were at a standstill or declined altogether. Such cases remain a mystery. Invariably poison has forced itself before me. But when or where is the query. We have much to learn that is curious in this matter. Bees will work on digitalis or fox glove and lobelia, and tobacco flowers. A feed delivered to a hungry queen from the above bouquet might prove disastrous and possibly in a last year's case it would certainly prove fatal to her in this delicate infatigable stage.

Bees will visit such flowers, a novice should know, only in an emergency. I have seen them on all the above, but with what result I cannot tell.

CHRYSANTHEMUMS.

These bright graceful flowers are yearly growing in favor. Plants grow from 12 to 18 inches high and bear a profusion of bell-shaped flowers being belted and zoned with the most clear and vivid colors. The intenseness of coloring has earned them the name of "Painted Daisies." Few flowers are finer for cutting or bouquet making than the chrysanthemum. In the garden, the chrysanthemum has for some time past been supplying that pulpit with lovely bouquets formed from several varieties of the above. I must give her the credit and confess a though I never saw the chrysanthemum so fine until I saw the several kinds so clustered. They certainly enliven the desk of that young and popular clergyman, Mr. Wright. They would produce a pleasing effect in our church in Ontario. Try it—anybody, and see.

As I look at flowers arranged in their heavenly beauty, gently moving in the breeze, as if promulgating, they seem trying to talk to me and I listen with delight as I inhale their inspirations of love and purity.
