WHERE THE MONEY IS.

Money enough; where is it? asks the Buffalo Express. Probably the farmers can tell where some of it is. The report of the Agricultural Department at Washington, issued a few weeks ago, said the farmers had over six billions of dollars more in 1905 than ten years earlier. Further, they received millions more for their crops last year than for many years previously. It is said the farmers are able to establish banks, buy railroad and other stocks, and invest in various enterprises. Again, the thrifty working people have money laid by. A few years ago many of them gambled on margins and poured their hard cash into Wall street at the rate of millions a day. Now the gambling fever is subsided and the money is in savings banks. The few made money, the many lost When the crash came in Wall street people began taking care of their own money instead of handing it to some bucket shop operator to invest (and lose). In Canada, according to Vice-President Stewart of the Sovereign Bank, the people have deposits in the post office, and other savings banks amounting to \$600,000,000. That is a tidy sum, drawing a low rate of interest, to be sure, but the money is safe. When the cash is wanted and good security is offered, it will be found. Naturally, Wall street is short of funds for speculative purposes, and that is where the squeal is coming
