TAVERNITO GOES FOR TRIAL.

Other Italians Swear That He Did the Stabbing.

Toronto, Oct. 6.—In Magistrate Ellis' court yesterday the Italians connected with the murder of Amos Marlow at Mimico, were given a hearing. Pasquale Tramboli said that Dominique Tavernito "no keel him in bar, he keel him outside."

Tavernito and Bruno Bartello were committed for trial for murder, though T. C. Robinette and J. M. Godfrey tried to establish that the stabbing had occurred during a general melee, so that a manslaughter charge might be substituted.

The Italians held as witnesses swore that Bartello and Marlow started to fight and clinched when Tavernito stepped in and did the stabbing.

Up to that moment he had not been mixed up in the row.

Hon. George W. Ross, former Premier of Ontario, has, it is said, been agreed upon for the office, and has signified his willingness to accept. A formal announcement in this connection may be looked for shortly.

SUPERINTENDENT SHORT.

Speculations Said to Reach Hundreds of Thousands of Dollars.

Peoria, Ill., Oct. 6.—Newton C. Dougherty, for many years city superintendent of schools, was arrested yesterday upon an indictment by the grand jury, charged with forgery. The arrest is the result of the examination by the grand jury of the books of the Peoria School Board. Within a comparatively brief space of time a shortage of \$75,000 was discovered, but the further discovery was made that the speculations have been extending over a long term of years. The shortage will reach hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Mr. Dougherty is president of the Peoria National Bank, a heavy stockholder in the Dime Savings and Trust Co., the Title and Trust Co., and other concerns, and a trustee of the fund of \$175,000 held by the National Educational Association.

TRIAL OF CHARLES GOW.

Defence Will Attempt to Prove That Shot Was From Inside.

Peterboro, Oct. 6.—On Monday next the trial of Charles Gow for the killing of Thomas E. Hill will begin before Mr. Justice Street at the Assizes here. Edward Meredith, K. C., of London will be the prosecuting attorney and R. M. Dennistoun of Peterboro will have charge of the case for Gow. It is said the defence will rely on their ability to prove that the boy was killed by a shot from within the house fired by his father in an endeavor to drive off the men menacing the house.

FEELING AGAINST COUNT WITTE.

St. Petersburg Thinks He Is Unworthy of Any Special Honor.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 6.—A strong sentiment against Count Witte developed at a caucus of the St. Petersburg municipality Wednesday evening, called to discuss civic action in recognition of his services at Portsmouth. Suggestions that a banquet be given in his honor and that he be presented with the freedom of the city or an address were rejected, and a resolution was adopted declaring that he is not worthy of any special honor because his services at Portsmouth "were only a redeeming sacrifice for the political mistakes in which he has acquiesced, and which were responsible for the war."

Students Causing Trouble. Despite the grant of autonomy, placing the administration and policy of the universities in the hands of elected rectors and councils of professors who are thoroughly in sympathy with the reform work, the educational situation is darkening, and there is a prospect that the hot-headed zeal of student reformers and the activity of non-student agitators at students' meetings may lead to another suspension of work at the universities. The St. Petersburg students have instituted a boycott of several professors who are disliked on account of their political opinions and have broken up their classes by disorder.

Weeding Out Incompetents. In a rescript addressed to the Minister of Marine, Emperor Nicholas directs him to retire compulsorily all naval officers who are unable to fulfill the higher requirements which the projected reforms in the service will demand.

Another G. T. P. Contract Let. Montreal, Oct. 6.—The contract for the Lake Superior branch of the G.T.P. from Fort William to Lake Superior Junction, about 210 miles, was awarded yesterday to Foley Bros., Larson & Co. of Winnipeg. This award means about 500 miles of the G. T. P. will be under actual construction by end of October, and it is hoped fully 1,000 miles will be under way by the end of November. The stipulation provides the contract must be done in time to move grain in 1907.

Might Have Been Worse. Pembroke, Oct. 6.—A party consisting of H. D. Strickland and wife, W. L. Hunter and wife, met with an accident yesterday morning while driving to the Beachburg Fair. The horses became unmanageable and struck a telegraph pole throwing the occupants out. Mrs. Strickland had her collar bone broken.

Two Heavy Judgments. Sarnia, Oct. 6.—Two judgments, one for \$3,600 in favor of Thomas MacKenzie, and the other for \$2,000 in favor of Joseph Polvey, have been rendered against the Grand Trunk Railway in the Lambton County Court. Both were suits for personal injuries.
