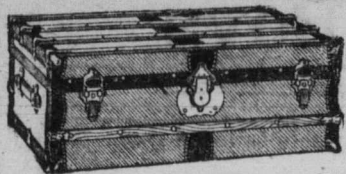

London, Aug. 22.—Mrs. Arthur Hamilton again has failed to swim the English Channel. She claims she has established a woman's record by being in the water 20 hours, reached within three miles of her objective.

Ottawa, Aug. 22.—At the annual shoot of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, which closed Saturday, Captain McEldin, Pictou Rifles, won \$15 with a score of 23 in the Sherwood competition, range 500 yards, five rounds to be fired within 45 seconds.

Bomb Thrown at Belfast.
Belfast, Aug. 22.—A bomb was thrown in Tyrone street last night. A woman was seriously hurt and five others less badly wounded.

United Farmers in Quebec.
Quebec, Aug. 22.—The United Farmers of the Province of Quebec made their first appearance in the province when they addressed a meeting of farmers at Charlebourg yesterday. About a thousand farmers attended the meeting. All the speakers stressed the need for organization socially, economically and commercially.

PHYSICAL DEFECTS AMONG CHILDREN

Startling Discoveries Made by Medical Staff on Quebec Health Train

(Canadian Press by Leased Wire.)
Quebec, Aug. 22.—That physical defects among the rural Canadian far exceed those found among urban children is one of the startling discoveries made by the medical staff of the First-Canada Child Health Train which arrived here today.

one third of its itinerary of the province. The child health train consists of two specially equipped cars, carrying both assistants and a staff, which conducts examination of children under 14 years of age.

Its operations are being carried on under the direction of the child care Association of Montreal, with the endorsement of the Provincial Red Cross, McGill and Montreal Universities.

Transportation is being furnished gratis by the Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk Railways.

Much interest in the novel train has been shown at the points visited so far.

Moncton, N. B., Aug. 20.—Warren Gross, a well known C. N. R. locomotive engineer, died at the Moncton Hospital this morning.

Some weeks ago Mr. Gross, after attending the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers' convention at Cleveland, O., visited his daughter at Moose Jaw, where he was taken seriously ill. He entered a hospital there and recovered sufficiently to return home, but had been in failing health ever since. On Monday last he underwent an operation, from which he failed to rally.

Deceased had been in the Government service for 44 years, being employed as a locomotive engineer during the greater part of the time. He was 63 years old and is survived by his wife, one son, Guy, of Medicine Hat, and one daughter, Mrs. John Williamson, of Moose Jaw, Sask.
