An accident, which might have resulted seriously and possibly fataly, occurred on the P. E. Island Railway Saturday night last. As the exprestrain from Summerside was on its way it struck a broken rail about a mile west of Elliotts. This was about 8 o'clock. The engine was partially derailed and the baggage car totally derailed and thrown over at an angle of 45 degrees.
