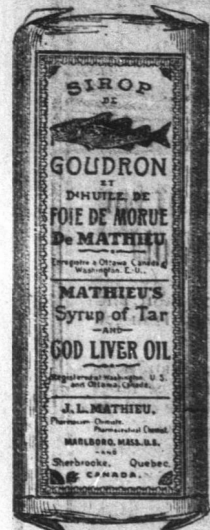

Roller shades may be satisfactorily leaned. Remove from the window, spread on a table, and rub them thoroughly with heated corn meal, wiping them off with a cloth dipped in gasoline.
Arrowroot will be found more satisfactory than cornstarch for thickening fruit sauces or jellies to be used with sauces. It does not change the fluid, nor does it cloud it at all.
When a color of a dress has faded owing to stains from lemon or other fruit juice, a good idea is to touch the spots with liquid ammonia, which will often restore the color.
OLDEST MUMMY.
Professor Elliot Smith, of the University of Manchester, declared recently that the mummy of Ra-Nefar, present in the museum of the Royal College of Surgeons, is six centuries older than any other known mummy. The body of Ra-Nefar, who was a high official in the Court of "Nefertu" of the fourth dynasty (3,700 B.C.), was found by Dr. Flinders Petrie at Medum, Egypt.
"The curious thing about the mummy," Professor Smith stated, "and the reason why it has preserved its present state is that it was encased in a thick layer of hard resin paste. It is mummified in a different manner from those Egyptian mummies belonging to a period some six centuries later, and which fell into powder when examined."
No evidence has appeared which will date the skeleton of the paleolithic man, discovered recently in the Dordogne, further back than 20,000 years, said the Rev. A. Irving, at the Victoria Institute, W. C.

HOUSEHOLD NOTES.

Dipping the tips of the fingers in warm olive oil every night is the best method for keeping the nails in good condition.
Raw eggs rubbed into the hair and scalp before washing are excellent, and tend to prevent the hair from turning gray.
To clean rugs, lay them straight and brush with a stiff, dry scrubbing brush. This is much better than shaking or beating them.
Though it is extravagant, the substitution of cream or milk in the making of pumpkin pie will result in a most delicate dessert.
In making cranberry jelly or jam, much less sugar will be required if the sugar is not added until the fruit is well cooked.
When cooking a spare rib, peel four apples, core and cut in half; bake them with the pork. They will be found a delicious accompaniment.
A good salve to use for the lips when they are inclined to crack is composed of half an ounce of lanoline and an equal part of honey or glycerine.
Ivory knife handles that have become yellow from constant washing may usually be whitened by rubbing with emery paper and polishing with chamofa.
Keep a pumice stone by your sink. When there are brown streaks in your granite, porcelain lined or steel settles, rub them off with the stone.
A clean cloth dipped in hot water and then placed in a saucer of bran will clean white paint and not injure it. The soft bran acts like soap on the paint.
When making aprons, especially those to be used in doing housework, do not forget a large pocket. It will save many a step in dusting in picking up.
A crust of bread is best to clean a sticky bread or cake pan. Never use a knife or anything that will scratch the surface and invite more sticking thereafter.
A small button of garlic in a quart of vinegar will give it a mysteriously delicious flavour, and will also immensely improve salads or anything with which it is used.
A refreshing drink for afternoon card parties is made of equal parts of ginger ale and grape juice. Serve in straight, thin glasses, with a maraschino cherry floating on top.
In putting down linoleum or oil cloth have strips of moulding nailed on the edges, next to the baseboard.
