The growth in the number of tele phones in Canada has been continu ous since the first statistics were compiled for 1911, when 302,759 were reported. In 1922 this had increased to 944,029, or an increase of 212 per cent. in 11 years. When compare with the increase of 21.95 per cen in the population from 1911 to 1921 this development is quite remarkable The greatest increases since 1914 have een in Ontario with 173,000 mo elephones, and in Saskatcheway with an increase of 70,000, although the latter province shows the greet est rate of increase, viz., 270 per cer

#### Types of Paving in Montreal

There have been various kinds of paving laid in Montreal in recent years and at the present time asphalt and granite setts are being used almost ex-clusively with preference for asphalt. The total length of streets in Montreal is 837 miles of which 147 are laid with waterbound macadam but this type of paving will not be used to any great extent in the future. There are 10 miles of asphalt macadam, 151 miles of asphalt concrete and sheet asphalt, 28 miles of brick pavement, 7.8 miles of concrete, 1.5 miles of block asphalt, 1.4 miles of wood block pavement, 26.7 miles of granite blocks, and 462 miles of earth roads.
