Explorer Who First Reached South Pole Will Lecture Here Tomorrow

Not since the homecoming of Theodore Roosevelt from the pursuit of big game in the equatorial jungles has the arrival of anyone on American shores evoked such a royal welcome as is now being accorded to Capt. Roald Amundsen.

Over 350 trained animals of almost every known variety are used in presenting the program of the Barnes circus—nearly every act is given by animals. A large clown troupe with their clean-cut comedy stunts are given a prominent place in the entertainment and a line of comedy animals are their able assistants.

The Al G. Barnes circus will exhibit next Monday and Tuesday, May 26-27. The tents will be located at Victoria park. Two performances will be given daily and a gorgeous street parade at 10.30 each morning.

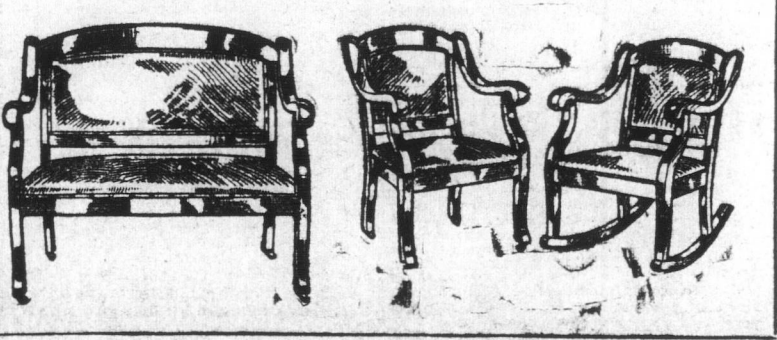

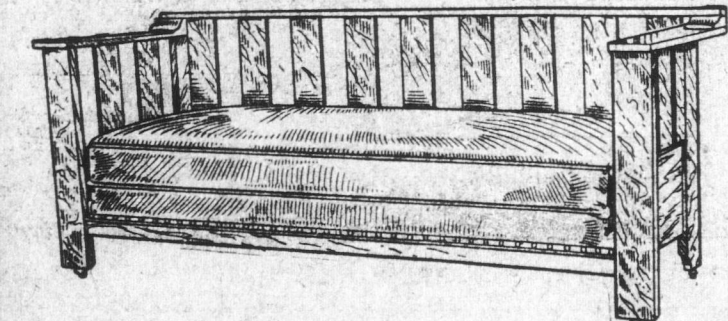

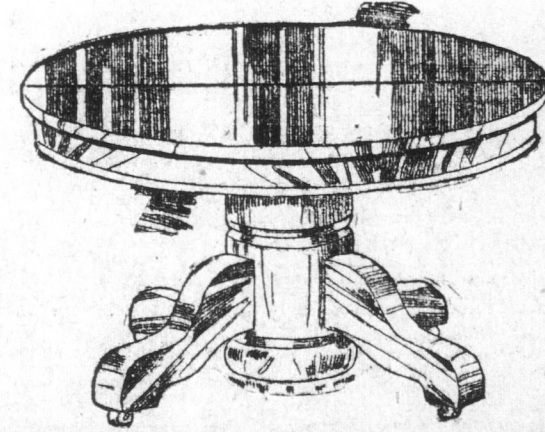
