Fifty Persons Killed or Injured by the Fall of a Church Roof.
CANADIAN.
The Government has issued a check for \$22,000 to Canada Brea. on account of the Kingston dry dock.
Hon. J. A. Chapleau was sufficiently recovered yesterday to be able to attend to departmental business at his own house.
Bishop O'Mahony, of Toronto, is reported to be out of danger. The bishop is still very weak, but there is every hope of his recovery.
Rev. R. A. Bilkey, late assistant rector of the Church of the Ascension, Toronto, has accepted a call to the Anglican Church at Bowmanville.
The customs outputs of Port Rowan and Tilsonburg, in addition to Dover, have been placed under the survey of the newly created port of Simcoe.
Hon. Edward Blake concluded his argument for the appellants in the C. P. R. vs. Conner & McEldan Friday evening, after speaking nine days. Dalton McCarthy opened his argument for the respondents.
In the case of Pinkney vs. McCord at the Toronto Assize Court the jury found a verdict for the plaintiff for the full amount of damages asked, viz., \$20,000, for having alienated his wife's affections and had improper relations with her.
Owing to the great scarcity of teachers in Manitoba at the present time, the Department of Education has decided to close the present session of the Winnipeg Normal School for first and second class teachers on Feb. 26, instead of March 5, as provided in the regulations of the department.
The mortality returns for Canadian cities for the last month show a large increase over the corresponding period for last year. In Montreal the deaths were 484, or 2.83 per thousand; Toronto, 1.39 per thousand; Quebec, 2.88; Hamilton, 1.34; Ottawa, 1.78; Winnipeg, 1.24; Victoria, B.C., 1.66.
