PORT STANLEY

Continued from Page One.

The fine new yacht, the Bethama, owned by Hon. C. S. Hyman and Mr. J. C. Duffield, is in port receiving a new coat of paint and other improvements. She is a beautiful craft, steel built, and finished in mahogany. There are few finer pleasure boats in the inland waters of this country, and every day an admiring throng of visitors pay a visit to the handsome ship.

Beach Looks Good.

The beach is much better than last year, and is well kept. The breakwater has accomplished one purpose in any event, and that has been to considerably widen the beach on the west side. Many feet more have been added, and there is an extremely fine stretch there now.

Boat houses and bathing places will be unusually abundant this summer, and the rapid development along these lines is anticipated in view of the considerable number of visitors certain to come from the American side.

On the Heights.
The Heights look well. A big roller rink adorns the lawn of the Invererie, and, according to reports, it is well patronized. This lawn is well kept, the city's portion of the Heights suffering by comparison. It does not present a very tidy appearance, and is not in the least inviting. A few days' work by a staff of men would make marked improvements, and would certainly make it more attractive than at the present moment.

Cottages in Demand.
Cottages are in great demand, and the supply will not be adequate. The backward summer has caused a change in many of the arrangements, but no cottage will be uncoccupied. Every owner has a waiting list.

On the whole, the Port never looked better, never seemed more prosperous or held a brighter future.

Business will certainly boom, and there will be more visitors than at any other previous time.

The London and Lake Erie Railway Company have made preparations to handle big traffic, and are looking forward to a most successful season. The Pere Marquette have also made preparations to handle scores of excursions, particularly from cities and towns in Western Ontario.

The big Pere Marquette ferry is making regular trips twice a day to Conneaut, and is handling thousands of tons of coal a month. She handled more cars of coal during May than had been handled for many years in a single month. She is a big, staunch, strong ship, not so much built on the hurricane deck as the ill-fated Bessemer, but looks fit to battle with any kind of a sea. The two boats look much alike, and standing on the pier one would imagine that Capt. "Bob" McLeod was again bringing the Bessemer to Port.

Little credence is given here to the reports that the wreck of the Bessemer has been found off Long Point. The people of the Port insist that she is lying in deep water near here.

Much interest is being taken in the report that the Government intended instituting a big programme of improvements. A breakwater on the east side is necessary, and more room inside the harbor. If this work is undertaken, the Port will be the busiest shipping spot along Lake Erie.
