THREATENS BIGGER BRITISH STRIKE

Labor Leader Says the Next Struggle Will Be of Unparalleled Magnitude.

GOING BACK TO MINES

Only the Surface Men Holding Out Against Advice of Miners' Federation.

London, April 8.—If the surface men's grievance can be settled there seems nothing to prevent a resumption throughout the coal fields of the United Kingdom. The protests of the Yorkshire and Fife miners against the federation's decision are not likely to be followed by action. The Miners' Associations of these counties have already recommended that the men return to work.

Some indication of the ideas in the minds of the labor leaders as to the future course of labor struggles was given in a speech delivered by Vernon Hartshorne at Maesteg, Wales, yesterday. He declared that the result of the coal strike would be the banding together of the coal owners, railway magnates, manufacturers, land-owners and capitalists of all kinds to coerce the Government into adopting legislation to prevent the workers from ever again "holding up the nation." Therefore, he declared, the workers must similarly band themselves. The transport workers, miners and railway men must unite in the preparation for the next fight, which, he said, would be of a magnitude never before seen.

VIENNA AGAIN ASTONISHED

Another Non-Royal Betrothal Sanctioned by the Emperor.

Vienna, April 8.—This city is astonished over another non-royal betrothal in the imperial family, this being between Archduchess Elizabeth Françoise, daughter of Archduke Francis Salvator, and Count George of Waldbourg.

Countess Elizabeth is enamored with Count George, who is her brother's tutor and a cavalry lieutenant.

The Emperor sanctioned the love match at the outset, but enjoined secrecy until the formal announcement of the betrothal in the ceremonies in connection, which he attended on Sunday.

In a measure his retirement can be put on a business basis. During Mr. Monk's regime there has been absolutely nothing done, as the minister was unable to decide between conflicting interests.

THREE PERSONS PERISH IN QUEBEC FLOOD

Man and Two Children Swept to Death When River Breaks Bounds.

[Canadian Press.] Sherbrooke, April 8.—One man, E. Poulin, and two children named Veilleux, have been drowned in the river near Compton.

Mrs. Georges Veilleux and her six children, with Poulin, were driving to a party last evening, when the rig got near the Coaticook River a tremendous flood broke over the top of the road.

The rig was overturned, and its occupants thrown into the raging stream. Poulin went down at once, and his body has not been recovered.

Three of the children were dragged out in a short time by eyewitnesses of the accident.

Mrs. Veilleux and the other three children floated down the river, until the mother managed to catch hold of a stump. To this she clung for three hours, her children hanging on to her skirt.

The scene was a terrible one. In the gathering darkness, wild attempts were made to throw ropes to the victims. Afterwards a raft was constructed, and it was smashed up four times before it could be put alongside Mrs. Veilleux and her children, two of the latter being dead when taken from the water, their hands still clutching their mother's skirt.

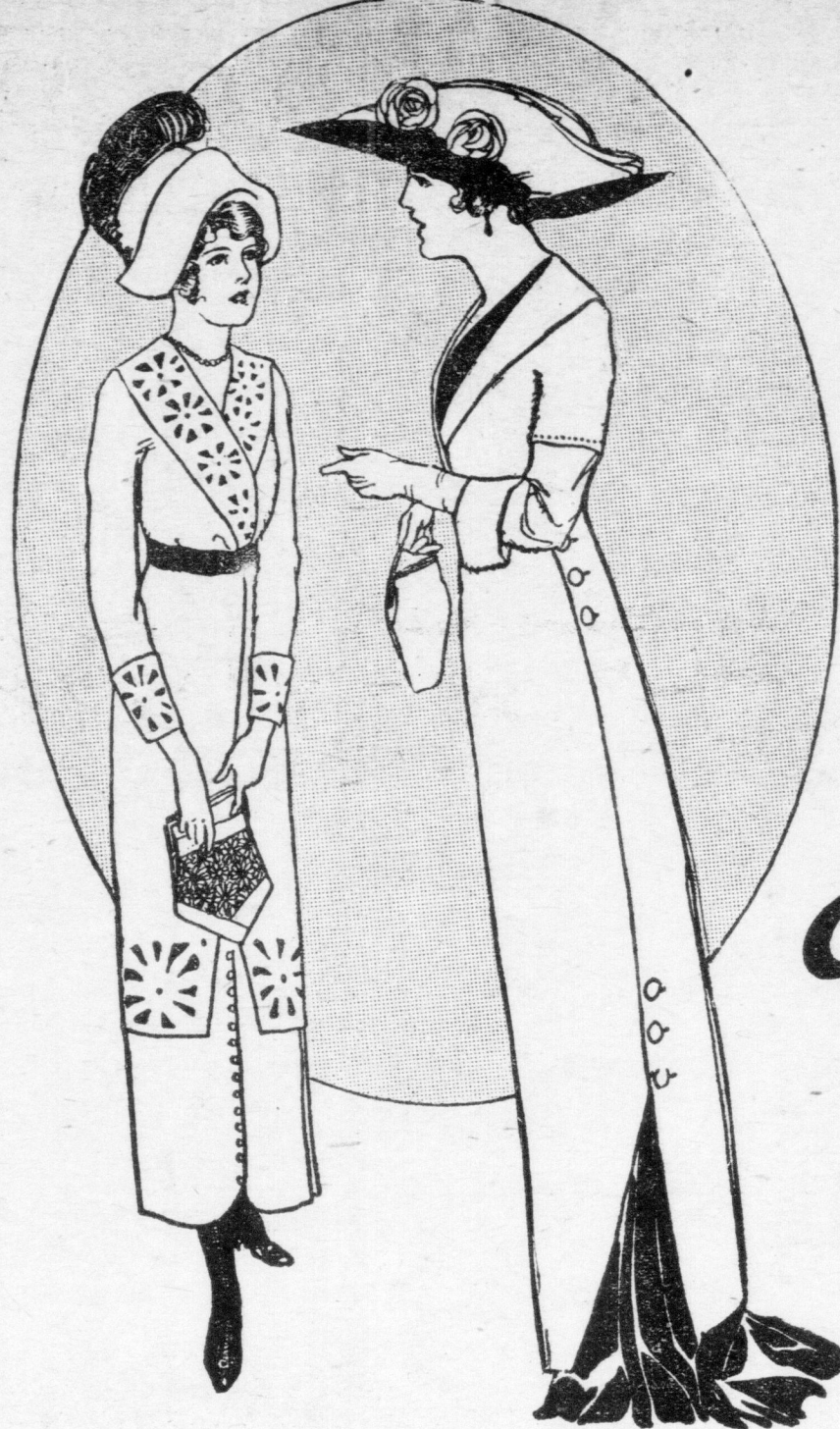

GREAT OVATION FOR SIR WILFRID

The Liberal Leader Cheered by Commercial Travellers at Quebec Banquet.

MAKES HAPPY SPEECH

Says There's No More Useful Class Than the Men of the Grip.

Quebec, April 8.—Never before, not even in the zenith of his Premiership, was Sir Wilfrid Laurier given so spontaneous and so loyal a reception as that accorded to him at the Chateau Frontenac here tonight, when he was one of the guests of honor at the annual banquet on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of the founding of the Association of Commercial Travellers of the City of Quebec. At the very mention of his name by the chairman, Mr. A. G. Godin, the 200 guests assembled about the tables in the banquet hall went wild with enthusiasm, and continued cheers rang out for Canada's grand old man.

Sir Wilfrid acknowledged the ovation with his genial, warm-hearted smile, and the guests waited their napkins and made the special hall resound with their cheers.

Hon. Mr. Pelletier, who replied first to the toast to Canada, limited his remarks to an appeal to put aside politics when working in the interests of Quebec, and he predicted a bright and prosperous future for the port and city of Quebec.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier was accorded another ovation when he rose to speak. He was in excellent form, and his ready wit and eloquent remarks were continually interrupted with cheers and applause.

Roosevelt Believes the Country Will Go as Illinois Goes.

Lafayette, Ind., April 8.—All day long Colonel Roosevelt fought as hard as he could for victory in tomorrow's presidential primary in Illinois. In his opinion, as he expressed it today, the result of the fight will be of first importance in determining the outcome of his whole campaign. When it was all over and the colonel was ready to board his train to pass out of the state, he said: "My hat is in the ring, and it is going to stay in the ring."

In one of his speeches today, he said: "We look to Illinois to set the keynote of this campaign. Illinois stands in the most important position of any state in this campaign."

To a large crowd in the opera house at Decatur, the colonel made one of the most vigorous speeches of his campaign.

"I am perfectly willing—and I am sure I speak for the farmers when I say it—that the farmers should pay their fair share, but they are not to be required to pay everything for an agreement like that."

"And in any future tariff arrangement I wish to see it made as a square deal in the interest of all."

[Canadian Press.] Chicago, April 8.—Voters are today engaged in casting their ballots at a state-wide primary, considered the most important in the history of Illinois.

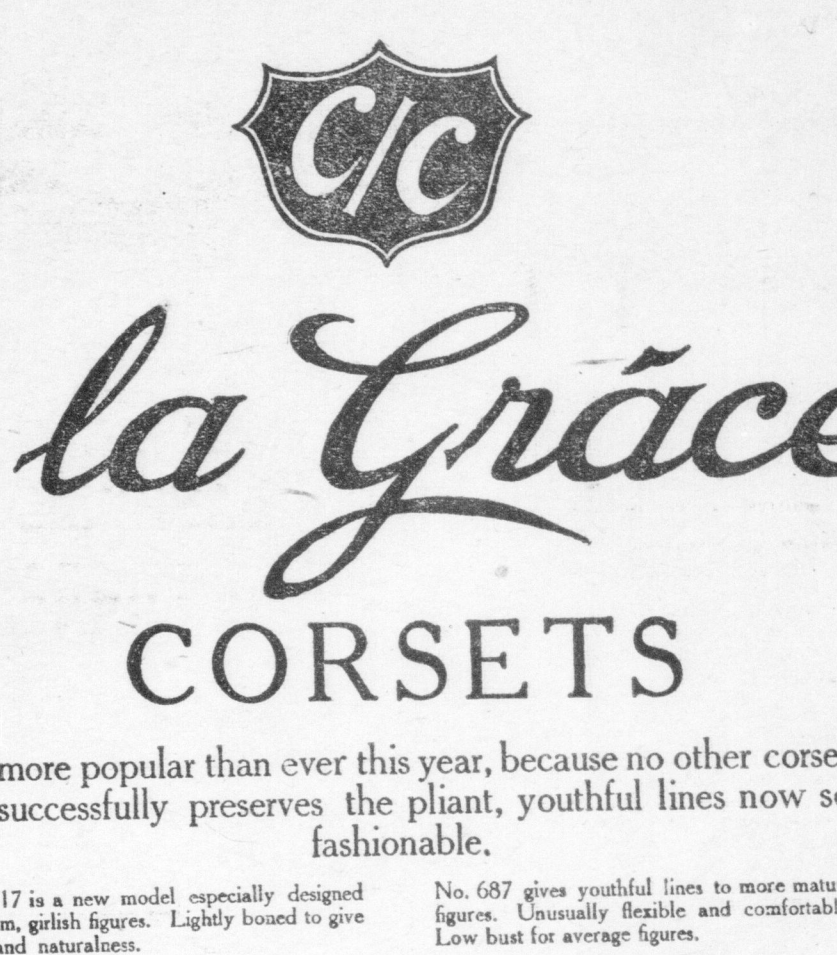
The day dawned beautifully and the forecast for the day was for fair weather. Early in the day it was predicted that more votes than were ever before cast at a primary election in the state would be recorded.
