



TORONTO, Feb. 6.—In anticipation of the campaign of the Methodist Church to raise \$4,000,000 next week in connection with the inter-church forward movement it is expected that next Sunday the Methodist ministers throughout Canada will be able to announce that at least \$750,000 of this amount has been subscribed by thirty men in six of the leading cities of the Dominion. NO CONQUEST IN SYRIA.

PARIS, Feb. 6.—(Havas.)—Premier Millerand declared that France did not intend to pursue a policy of conquest in Syria, and did not intend to menace the population's independence, but desired to establish a good administration in the country and see that justice was done.

Referring to Russia, M. Millerand said none of the Allies had adopted any definite policy toward soviet Russia. Concerning the plan for resuming commercial relations with the Russian cooperative unions, the premier asserted that the exports would be under control and if it were found they were being used to revictual the Red armles, they would be immediately stopped.

VON BUELOW ADVISES GERMANS WANTED NOT TO SUBMIT TO REST

BERLIN, Feb. 6.—Field Marshal von Buelow told the Lokal Anzieger today that Germans whose names are on the list of those whose extradition is de-manded by the allies "only did their duty to the fatherland," and that ex-tradition was ignominy to which "no good German would voluntarily sub-mit."

The field marshal declared he would never place himself at the disposal of the entente nations and expressed the belief that most of the commanders named in the allied list would take the same view. named in the allied list would take the same view.

It is understood that meetings of army and navy commanders were held on January 7, and it was unanimously concluded that evasion of the extradition clauses of the Versailles treaty was entirely compatible with German honor, and that no one must voluntarily surrender.
