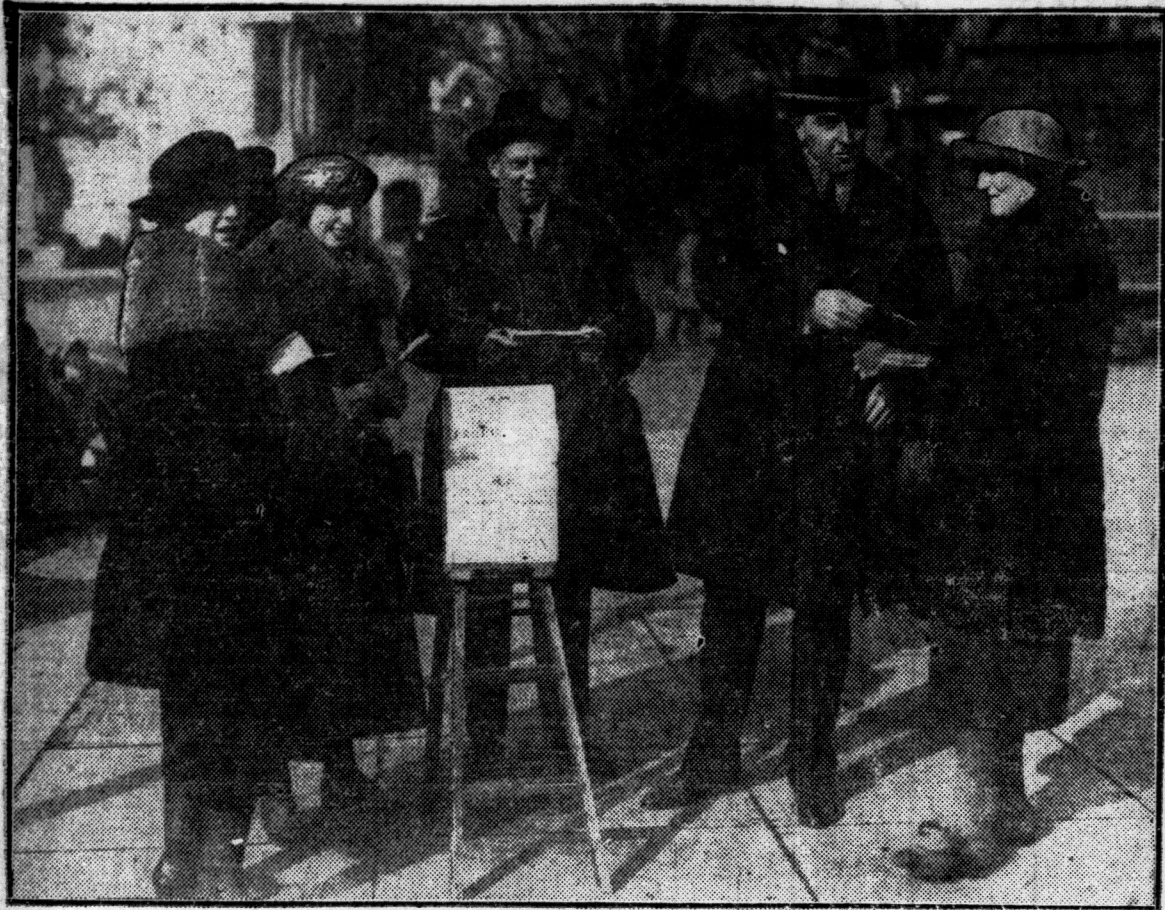


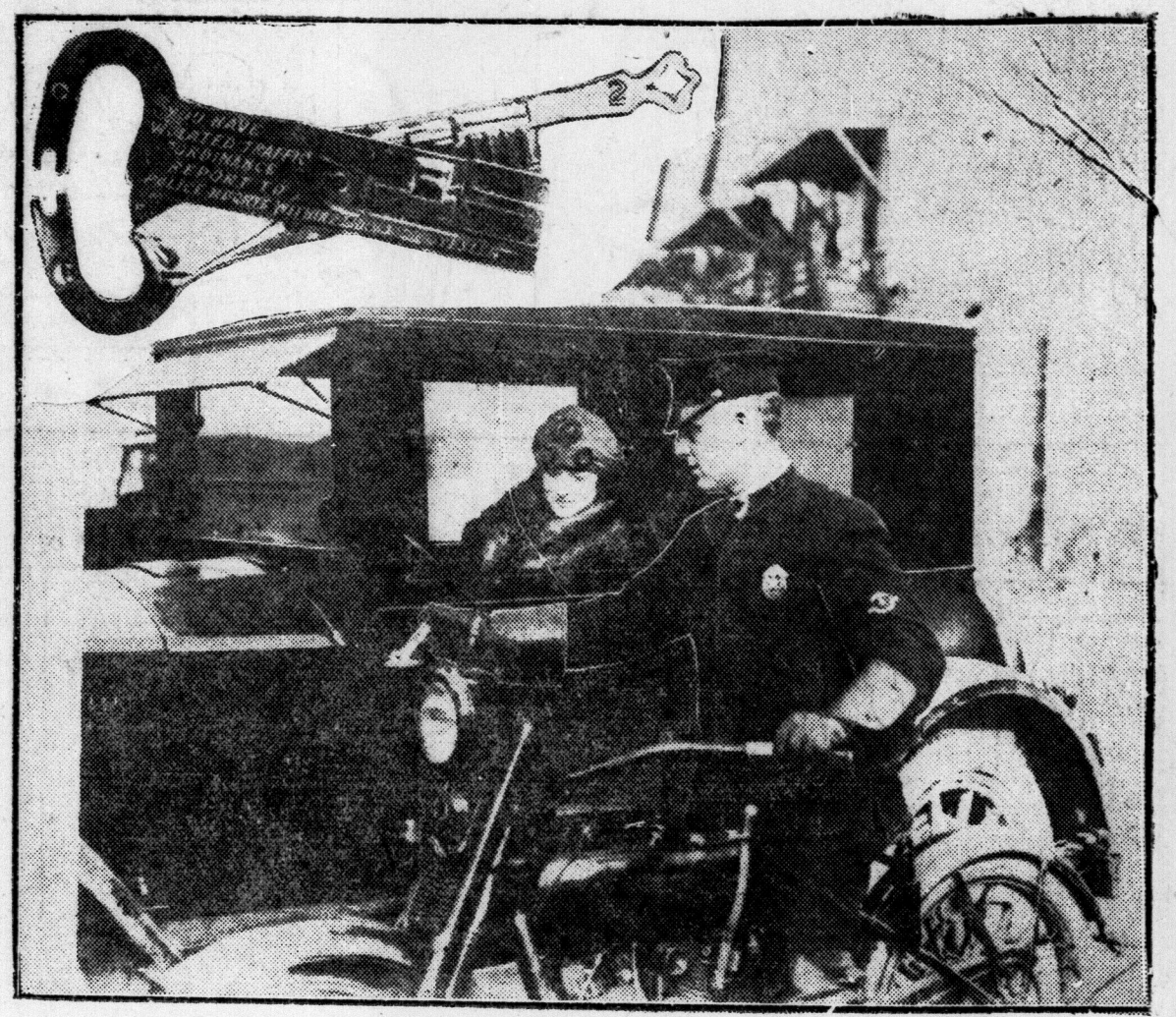

Charles Paddock, famous U.S. equestrian, all dolled up as marshal of a U.S. parade.



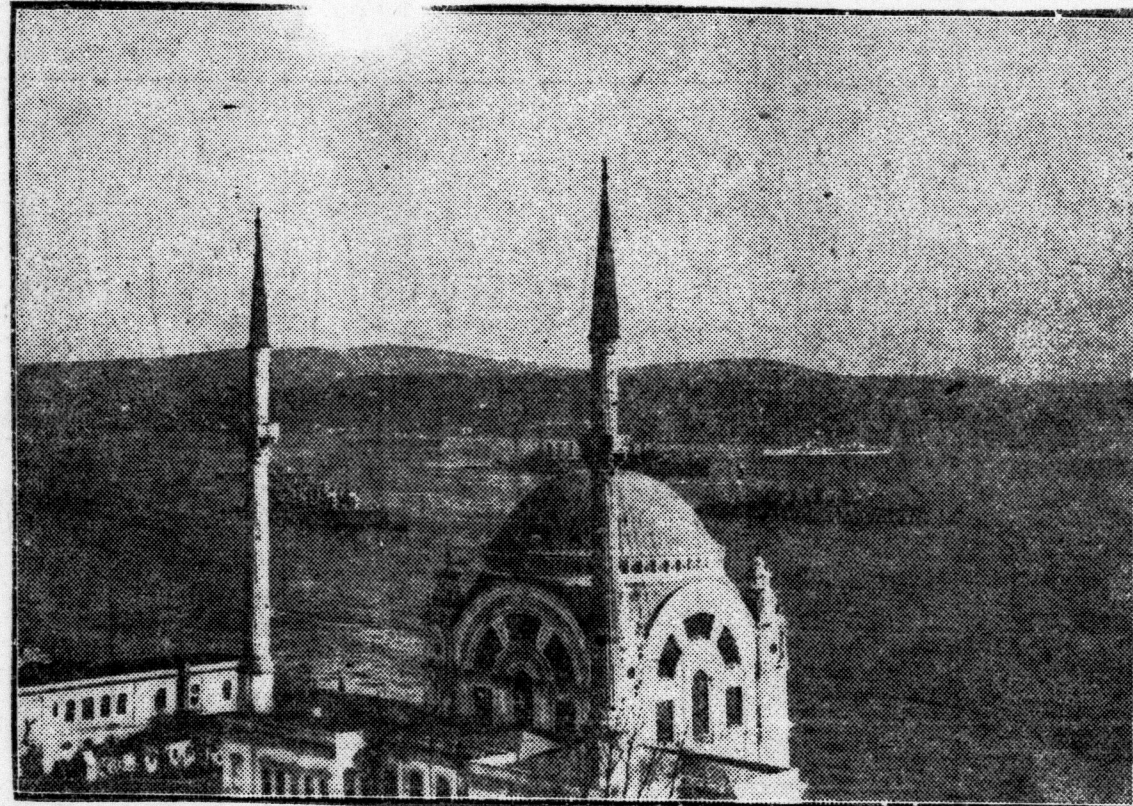

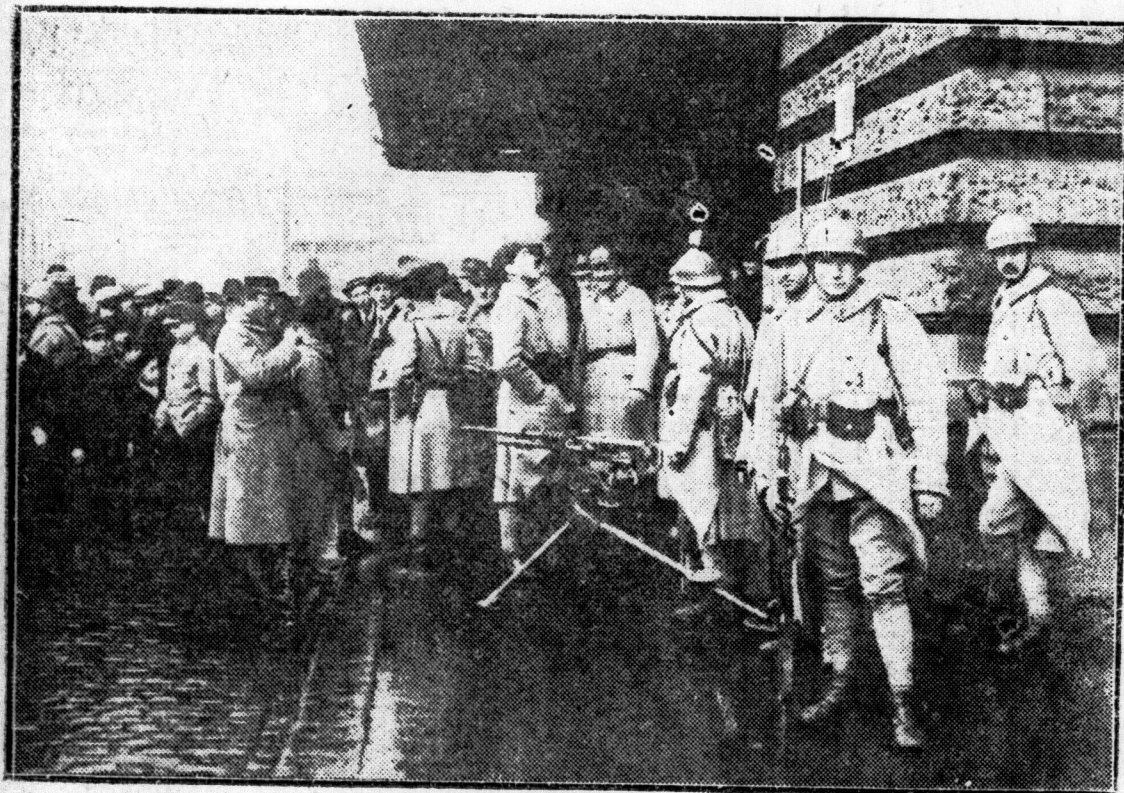
F. R. Wadleigh, new fuel administrator of the United States.

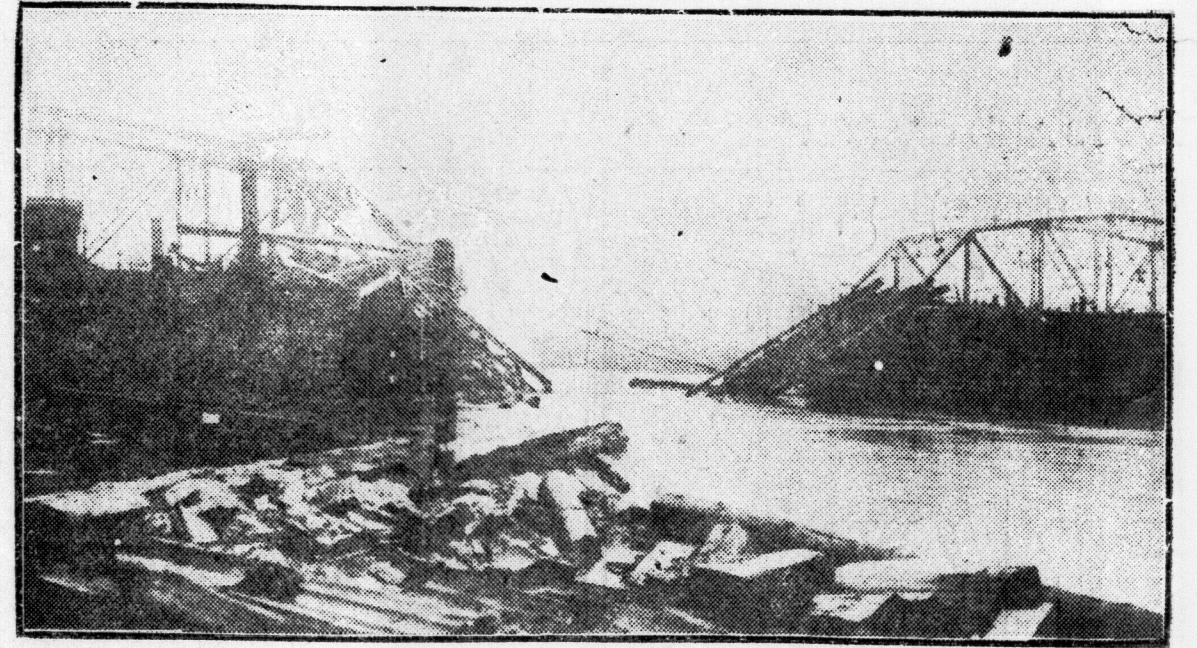
A French machine gun squad in a German city in the zone of occupation.



James Simpson, new president of Marshall Field and Co., Chicago, started with the firm as an errand boy.



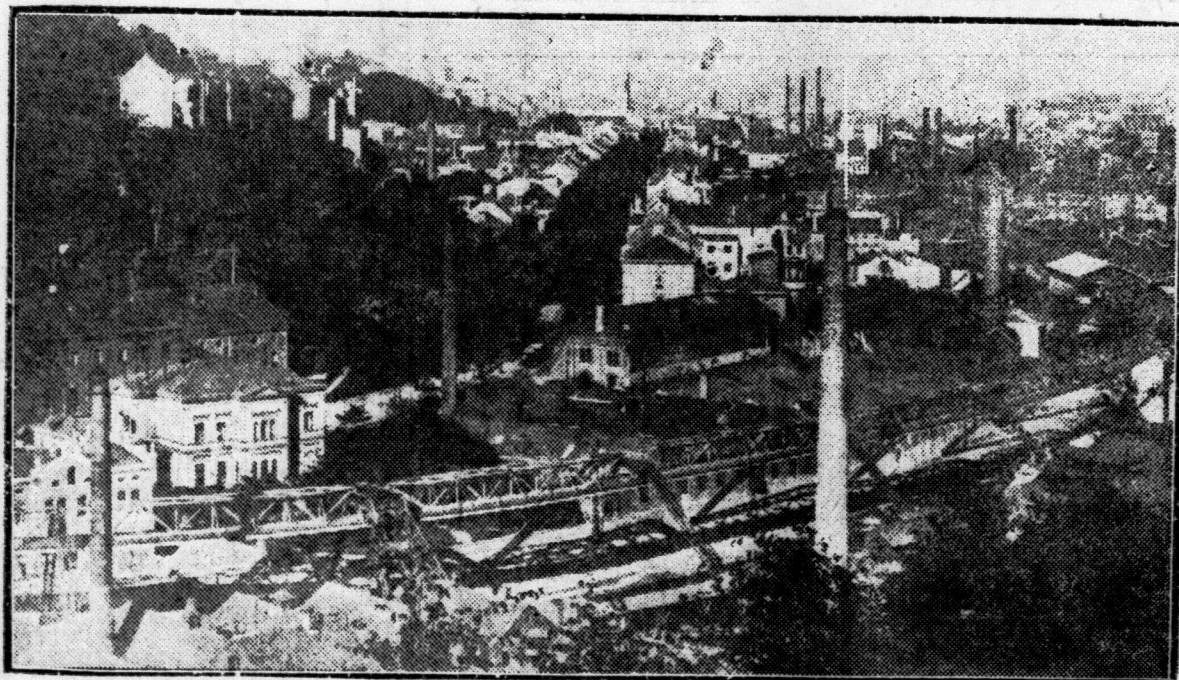
