

## SOLID ADVICE TO B.C. FRUIT GROWERS

Must Perfect Their Shipping  
and Marketing Arrange-  
ments to Participate in the  
Trade of Saskatchewan

That B. C. vegetable growers must send their products on the markets of the northwest as early as they wish to obtain the best prices for their produce, is the main message that has been received from Mr. J. C. Metcalfe, commissioner, with headquarters at Vancouver, in the form of a letter addressed to Mr. W. E. Scott, deputy minister of agriculture. Further advice is tendered to fruit growers to the effect that they must perfect their shipping facilities and marketing arrangements and give the greatest care to all the details in putting up the fruit. Mr. Metcalfe states that from the present reported heavy crop the good and finished product will sell, while the poor and unfinished may be going for sale.

The communication closes by pointing out that the success of the fruit business and agitation along this line depends almost entirely on the co-ordinated effort on the part of jobbers everywhere in Saskatchewan, and that the fruit growers must be of grade, to get the present tariff on fruit reduced from the American side. These points and agitation along this line are likely to be continued, as the life of the season by any action by the government in this direction should be opposed by the growers east and west most energetically.
