

## NEW ENTRANCE TO HIGH PARK.

A Committee and a Deputation Which Could Not Agree—Report of City Engineer.

The important subject of a better and more convenient entrance into High Park was considered yesterday by a sub-committee of the Board of Works, composed of Ald. Lennox (chairman), Bell, Lucas, Shaw and O'Leary (S. and J.). Rev. George Burdell, George Pauline and William Thomson, heads of a deputation of property owners interested in the proposed improvement. City Engineer Lennox submitted the following report on the matter:

Referring to the order of the sub-committee of the Board of Works, I report upon the cost of the proposed entrance to the extension of the Great Trunk Road, which is to be the entrance to the park from the northward, and to the road near railway crossing, a number of new buildings, including the present road, are now in course of erection.

Regarding the second proposition, viz., to construct a street 50 feet wide immediately north of the railway track from the junction of King and Queen streets to the west side of High Park, the cost of the same is estimated at \$10,000.
