NUMBER IV.

A furvey of the course of Nelson-river, taken along the south shore at high-water mark. Each course set by compass, variation 16°, 45', and measured by a wheel; with observations.

First course W. by N. half N. 74 chains.

HIS first course begins at Beacon A, on the point of marsh that parts Nelson and Hayes's-rivers; and goes to Beacon B that stands on the marsh towards Nelson-river. (See the chart)

Second course W. by N. 190 chains.

WHAYWEE-creek is 20 chains on this course. There are two other small creeks before the course ends. At the end is the geese tent, where the English and Indians in the season lie to kill geese, bearing S. W. Distance half a mile.
