DURING the past week, business in General Groceries has been exceedingly limited, with the exception of some classes of Teas, which have been in fair demand. This insolvity is owing to the lateness of the season, as well as to the numerous holidays which have occurred, and which, though chiefly observed texcept Dominion Day; by the French portion of our citizens, nevertheless very markedly interfered with business.

TRAS—Of both grades have been in better demand, and holders are much firmer in their views. The principal requirements have been in high-pri-ed Japans and low grade Young Hysons, the former of which have met ready sale in round lots at full rates, say from 55c to 50c, and there being somowhat of a scarcity, the stock now on hand of really choice held for full rates. Gunpowders, Imperials and Young Hysons of higher grades, are rather test inquired for, though held equally firmly Twankays continue in fair request, and are tirm, to which may be attributed, in great measure, the demand for low grade Young Hysons. Javas enquired for, but hardly obtainable. Bisets in ordinary demand.

Correc.—The demand is tiardly more than a retail one, and prices are unchanged.

STOAR—Lias had a fair local demand, principally for Bright Barbadoes and Porto Rico, but lots placed have been generally small, though at full prices. At the close of last week the Refiners bought largely in this market, and some five to six hogsheads changed hands; principally refining grades, but including also some grocery samples at full rates in bond. Pricos for cubas are a little exsier, owing to a slight increase of recent importations still prices asked are in no way changed, and the stock is by no means heavy.

Molaceus.—Little doing further than local trade, and prices and tone of market as previously reported.

FRUIT - For the season, Raisias have received better anontion, and stocks having become light, holders are looking for ligher prices. Sales, however, which have been chiefly of Layers and Valentias, have been at last week's quotations.

time—Is in moderate demand. Fair samples of Arracan in round lots have been placed at \$4.50 to \$1.55, while really good samples have changed hands at \$4.50. SALT—Is in good demand. Prices during the earlier part ruled as high as 70c for Liverpool Coarse, and 85c to 874c for Stoved. brices—Are only in ordinary demand. Naturess baving received a little attention, more especially for No. 2, for which, in round lots, 42 to 10 410 have been paid.

LOUR .- Receipts have been moderate, and with zitmited but stendy demand for local consumpnon, prices have varied little since the date of our iast. The supply of strictly choice baters Superfine has been barely adequate to the demand, and for and next totally adoption to the demand and to such relatively high prices rule, while there is a considerable surplus of old ground and low grade samples, which bolders being urgent to realize are pressed at comparatively for figures. We quote \$6.30 to \$6.70 as covering most transactions, occasional parcels being reported both above and below these figures. There are practically no demands for the higher grades, only single barrels or small broken lots changing hands. The lower grades are freely supplied, there being conelderable secent arrivals from the Western States. Fair prices relatively rule, but the demand is restricted and unsteady. Bags-The product of the local mills keeps the trade fully supplied, and parcels from abroad are difficult to quit at satisfactory rates, none, indeed, but the best receiving any attention

OATMEAL.—There is no export demand, and any sales noted consist of small broken lots. Upper Canada going at \$5 75 to \$8, and other samples ranging down to \$6 30. Comment—The local millers are selling in email lots at \$3 75 to \$4, according to quantity. Several round lots of Wastern kiln-dried are on the market, but beyond an occasional hundred or broken lot, there is none moving, though sellers are urgent and prepared to accept a rebate on recognized quotations if buyers in quantity could be met with.

Grain.—Wheat—Beyond a few carloads at \$1 50 to \$1.62], there is little to report. A good enquiry from exporters was expected in the fore part of the week, but adverse British and Western advices have hind a correcting influence, and the market closes with less animation and a slight tendency to decline. Pcas—The stock is in one hand, and prices are well maintained, but beyond an occasional small lot for Quebeo or local use, there is no demand, and rates so far as relating to round lots, are practically nominal.

COARSE GRAINS are nominal in the absence of any recent transactions.

Provisions-Fork-Little business can be noted prices are however firm and steady, holders in view of the limited stocks only selling as full rates can be made, while consumers only come forward to supply notical wants. Lard is scarce, and for the little changing hands full rates are obtained. Cutmeats -City cured and smoked hams sell in lots at 11c. to 12c., and by retail at 12c to 13c . shoulders and bacon in the like proportion. Parcels from a distance are however very irregular according to appearance, condition, &c., very low rates being in some cases accepted. It is far however the supplies from abroad have been small, and a nice well handled article would meet a fair demand at satisfactory rates. Butter-The supply of choice is small, and retail lots of really good sell at 16a, to 17a, according to quality, but the bulk of what is in stock is heated and inferior, and in the entire absence of export demand engages no attention for the time being. Great risk is incurred in forwarding butter during the summer heat, and most of the recent arrivals have been rained.

ASHES-Pots are in fair demand and prices have slightly improved. Fearls are neglected and practically nominal at \$5.40 to \$5.50.
