

LOBSTER FISHERY.

DEPARTMENT OF MARINE & FISHERIES, FISHERIES BRANCH, OTTAWA, 22nd March, 1879.

DUBLIC NOTICE is directed to the following Fishery Regulations adopted by the Governor-General in Council, on the 13th inst., rescinding all Orders in Council, on the 13th inst., rescinding all Orders in Council relating to the Lobster Fishery:

1. In that part of the Province of Nova Scotia, comprising parts of the Counties of Comberland and Colchester, on the Bay of Fundy, the Counties of Hants, Kings. Annapais, Digby, Yarmouth, Shelbourne, Queen's, Lunenburg, Halifax, Guyshorough, Richmond, Cape Breton and Victoria; also in the Province of New Brunswick, comprising part of the County of Westmoreland, on the Bay of Fundy, and the County of Westmoreland, on the Bay of Fundy, and the United St. John and Charlotte; it shall be unlawful to fish for, catch, kill, buy, sell or twithout lawful excuse) possess any Lobsters from the first day of Angust to the first day of April in each year.

2. In that part of the Province of Nova Scotia, comprising the Counties of Invertess, Antigonish, Pictou, and parts of Colchester and Cumberland, on Northumbortand Strait; and that part of the Province of New Brunswick comprising the Counties of Westmoreland (upart), Kent, Northumberland, Gloucester and Restinguiche; also in the Province of Queisec and Prince Edward Island; it shall, be unlawful to fish for, catch, kill, buy, sell (or, without lawful excuse) pessess any Lobsters from the 20th day of Angust to the 20th day of April in each year.

2. It Island be anlawful at any time to fish for, catch,

Lonsters from the 20th day of Angust to the 20th day of April in each year.

A It shall be unlawful at any time to fish for, catch, kill, http, sell or possess any female Loisters in spawn or with eggs attached, soft-shelled, or any young Lobsters of less size than nine inches in length measuring from head to tail exclusive of claws or feelers; and when caught by accident in nets or other fishing apparatus lawfully used for other fish, they shall be liberated alive at the risk and cost of the owner of the net or other apparatus, or by the occupier of the fishery, on either of whom shall devolve the proof of such netual ideration.
