ARTICLE VII

The Government of Bolivia shall exempt all equipment, materials and vehicles imported into Bolivia for the implementation of a project, from import duties and customs tariff and from other national, departmental and municipal taxes or charges. The said equipment, materials and vehicles shall be for the exclusive use of the project and shall be re-exported except for those which have become useless, are required permanently for the project or are transferred to another project of the Government of Canada.

ARTICLE VIII

The Government of Bolivia shall grant Canadian personnel:

- (a) The right to import into Bolivia and to re-export, free of import duties, customs tariff and other present or future duties, in one or several shipments their household and personal effects;
- (b) The exemption from payment of import duties, customs tariff and other charges and taxes on medicinal products and other articles of consumption or of daily use acquired for their personal requirements and those of their family, that may be legally imported into Bolivia. To this effect, a quota similar to the one granted by the Department of External Relations and Cult for cooperants of international technical cooperation shall apply. This exemption will not apply to personnel directly contracted by Canadian firms.

ARTICLE IX

Each Canadian staff member may import or export, free of any entry or customs duties, and any other national, departmental and municipal charges, a vehicle for his personal use. This privilege may be exercised every two (2) years. However, in the event of fire, theft or an accident causing major or non-repairable damages to the vehicle such privilege shall be renewable before this period has expired. Those vehicles shall be re-exported except those which have become useless or which are transferred to other persons who enjoy similar exemptions.

ARTICLE X

The Government of Bolivia shall guarantee Canadian personnel and their dependants the right to maintain bank accounts in foreign currency and export without any foreign exchange restrictions the money that they have imported into Bolivia.
