ARTICLE 2

Subject to special provisions contained in this Agreement that may change the privileges and immunities enjoyed by the Agency, representatives of its members, its officials and experts on missions for it, listed in the Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Agence de coopération culturelle et technique relating to the seat at the Institut de l'énergie des pays ayant en commun l'usage du français, signed November 17, 1988, the privileges and immunities contained in the latter Agreement shall remain unchanged.

ARTICLE 3

In order to establish the Secretariat for the purposes of organizing the Jeux de la Francophonie in Ottawa-Hull, the Government shall assign free of charge to the Agency furnished premises for use as an office. The Government and the Agency agree that the subject of the human resources necessary in order for the Agency to operate the Secretariat shall be addressed in a separate document according to terms to be agreed on between the Government and the Agency.

ARTICLE 4

Local authorities may enter the premises in case of fire and for maintenance purposes.

ARTICLE 5

- The Agency shall not allow the premises made available to it to be used as a place
 of refuge for persons seeking to avoid arrest, service or execution of a form of
 legal process, or an expulsion order made by the appropriate Canadian authorities.
- The Government shall ensure the protection of the premises and provide the
 assistance, as required, of the forces of law and order, at the request of the Agency
 or Secretariat.

ARTICLE 6

- The appropriate authorities shall facilitate admission to and departure from Canada by Agency staff, its officials, experts on missions for it and other persons invited by the Agency on behalf of the Executive Secretariat of the CIJF.
- 2. Where visas are necessary, those of the persons referred to in sub-article 1 *supra* shall be issued by the Government free of charge and as quickly as possible.
- 3. Subject to the aforementioned conditions of this Article and of this Agreement, the Government shall retain complete control of and full authority over the entry of persons or property into its territory, and over the conditions under which persons may remain or reside there.
