PRAYERS.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. St. Laurent (Quebec East), it was resolved,—That the following changes be made in the procedure of the House for the present session:

1. That the provisions of Standing Order 41 requiring forty-eight hours' notice and of Standing Order 42 requiring unanimous consent for a motion in a case of urgent and pressing necessity be suspended.
2. That Standing Order 65 respecting the appointment of Standing Committees be suspended.
3. That the provisions of Standing Orders 75 and 78, restricting bills to a separate reading in each sitting be suspended.
4. That Standing Orders 81, 85 and 120 respecting the presentation of certain reports and the printing and distribution of a list of statutory documents be suspended.

Government Orders, having been called, were allowed to stand.

The House resumed the adjourned debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Legaré, seconded by Mr. Weselak,—That the following Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General of Canada:

To His Excellency the Right Honourable Vincent Massey, Member of the Order of the Companions of Honour, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada.
