In the case of theses for the degree of Master, there must again be two examiners, not from the same department in McGill. The time is perhaps ripe for insisting that in all cases the second examiner shall be a member of a university other than McGill.

It might be well to accept the challenge of the writer to the Canadian Forum and to request a report on the theses presented and accepted during the past five years. A committee of men like Sir Andrew Macphail, Dr. C. W. Colby, and Dr. F. D. Adams, if they could spare a few days of their time, could rapidly review the theses, point out shortcomings, and assign praise where it is due.

This section closes then with two questions:

1. Should all theses be examined by an examiner who is not a member of McGill, as well as by an internal examiner ?
2. Should a small committee be appointed to investigate and report on theses during the last few years ?
