EXPOSITION

The following interesting and important exposition was drawn up by the American Government as an appeal to the people in order to point out the necessity of such mighty and efficient preparations for the campaign of 1915, as would assure its successful termination, by the expulsion of the British from every part of the American continent. The proposal, by the Secretary of War, for raising 100,000 men, was part of this plan of vigorous measures; but the arrival of the services of peace having been concluded, and the publication of the appeal since then, however, this document has been printed in America where it has been widely circulated to the extent of a million copies.
