

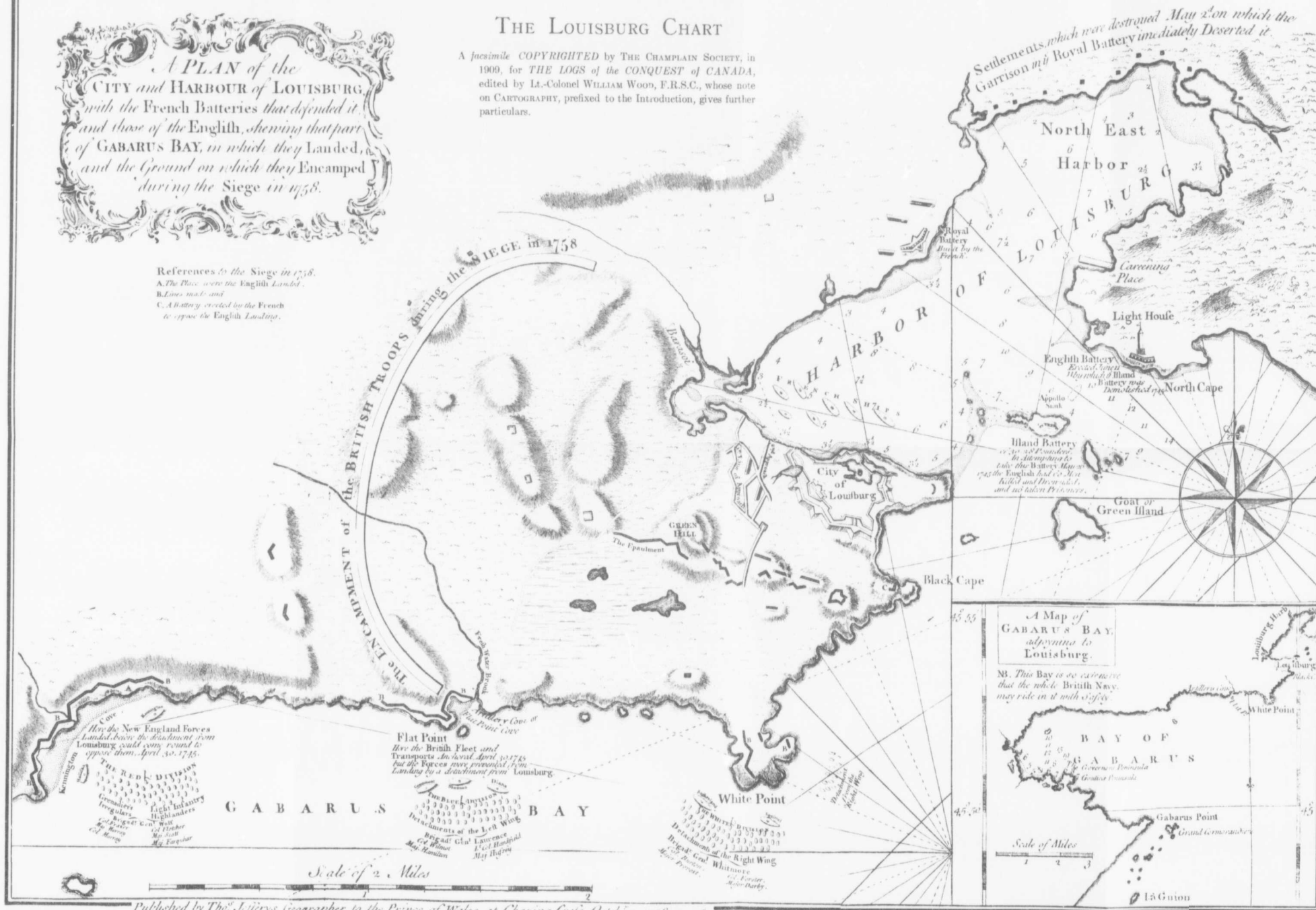
*A PLAN of the
