lows: In Bermuda, 982 officers and men; at St. Lucta, 100 men; in England and at the front, 35,420, and in training for overseas service in Canada, 65,000.

Make-Up of Forces.

The Canadian Expeditionary Force is made up as follows: The first contingent, consisting of the first division army troops and surplus units and line of communication units; the second contingent comprising the second division and line of communication units, a force of Canadian mounted rifles, an infantry reserve and depots. The first division, about 18,000 strong, which is in the field, consists of 12 hattalions of infantry in three brigades; a squadron of cavalry and cyclist company; 48 18-pounder and four 60-pounder guns with ammunition column; three field companies of engineers, a divisional signal company, a divisional train company, a divisional train composed of four companies of the Army Service Corps and three field ambulances. The Royal Canadian Dragoons and Lord Stratheona's Horse, A and B Batteries Royal Canadian Horse Artillery, an Automobile Machine Gun Brigade and six battalions of infantry, including the Princess Patricia's Regiment, accompanied the first division. The cavalry and horse artillery have been posted to a mounted brigade commanded by Brigadier-Gen. the Right Hon. J. E. B. Seely, S.D.S.O., and are still in England. So also are the automobile machine gun batteries. Five battalions of infantry are also still in England. One composed of detachments from mounted corps provides cavalry reinforcements; three furnish reinforcements for the infantry, and the fifth forms a general reserve.

Two armored motor machine gun units are being mobilized, one at Toronto and the other at Montreal.

Speaking of the force of Canadian Mounted Rifles, Col. Gwatkin says in a memorandum read by the premier, that when the army council decided on the form the assistance from Canada should take, disappointment was felt, particularly in the west, at the exclusion of cavalry and mounted rifles. So iong as trench fighting continued mounted troops were not required in the western theatre of operations.

But they were required in Egypt which was threatened with invasion and, moreover, it was not unreasonable to suppose that the situation in Belgium moreover, it was not unreasonable to suppose that the situation in Belgium and in France would undergo a change. Therefore, it was decided to proceed with the mobilization of 13 regiments of mounted rifles. In addition to the 12 "first line" battalions of the second division there are in Canada 24 "reserved" battalions in the various stages of development. These will be utilized as circumstances require; in Canada for draft giving purposes, or in England as training depots, or as complete units at the seat of war.

Colonel Gwatkin says that in addition to the three infantry depots and the cavalry depot provided in England for the first contingent, the 23rd. 30th and 32nd Battalions have lately been sent over to serve as depots for the infantry of the second division. Depots have also been formed in England for artillery, engineers and army service corps, etc. In Canada there are recruiting and training establishments for each of the units which the permanent force contributed to the first contingent and to the garrison of Bermuda.

Fund to Aid Kingston University-Presentation to Rev. Henry Gracey.


