The mail, baggage and typess work would, he believed, sil he complicated, and the passenger ser-fice would be less efficient. "If you put the Verk-street subway thru, and do not dispense with the thru tracks, everything will be com-plicated," he sold, 'while with the thru track system you will have as fine a station as there is in the world." 
