NICARAGUA CANAL TREATY.

No Definite Decision Has Yet Been Reached—Alaskan Boundary May Come In.

London, April 26.—No definite decision has yet been reached by the Foreign Office regarding the probable attitude of the United States Senate towards the projected Nicaragua Canal Treaty.

The negotiations proceeding on the subject of the Hay-Pauncefote treaty in this connection are understood to be based on the neutrality of the canal. If this can be definitely assured, it now seems likely that the British and American governments will agree to the Clayton-Bulwer treaty, the terms of which are understood to be more liberal than those of the Clayton-Bulwer treaty.
